How to vote

Sydney & NSW Trains Protected Action Ballot



You said that you are ready to fight for an Agreement that secures jobs and conditions. So far, management has refused to listen. This ballot is your chance to vote YES and tell management to get real on a fair deal.

Among the key sticking points are management's inadequate pay offer; changes to Clause 12 (the facilitation clause); no guarantees about your staff travel rights, inadequate commitments by management on safe use of contractors in a way that does not undermine permanent jobs, failure to restore 64 week redundancy provisions and management's refusal to limit changes to the Master Roster.

STEP 1: Vote early!

Don't leave it till last minute and risk missing out. Put your vote in and tell your mates to do the same.

STEP 2: Vote YES to every question

We need to vote **YES** to every question so that we have as many "action" options to choose from when negotiating the Agreement.

STEP 3: Tell your workmates!

To win the right to Protection Action we need everyone to submit their votes.

What is a Protected Action Ballot?

A Protected Action Postal Ballot is process that is overseen by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) to allow you to vote on whether you want to have the option to take industrial action. Winning this ballot gives you the option to take action to protect your conditions and rights without risking your job. This is extremely important and why you need to vote.



When you are filling out your ballot paper, it is important to remember that to vote YES, you must make sure that you place a TICK or a CROSS in the 'YES' BOXES. Please ensure that you do not mark the 'NO' BOXES in any way. The ballot should look like this:
