

Secretary's message

Dear members,

This month saw the release of the NSW Government's budget. What a disappointment. All of the transport announcements were just rehashed announcements - the recycling of news we'd already heard.

What was bitterly disappointing to see was the list of stations that have again been left off the list of those which will receive funding for accessibility upgrades. The most glaring one to me was Unanderra - a station that RTBU members have been passionately calling to be fitted with lifts for many vears. It infuriates me, and I know many of you, to see our Transport Minister and Premier constantly standing up and talking about the importance of customer service while cutting jobs, cutting services refusing to stump up the small amount of money it would take to make our transport accessible to people who really need it - older people, people with a disability, people with prams.

The NSW Government might think they're pulling the wool over the eyes of the public by releasing flashy papers and claiming to be improving transport services, but we know commuters have seen with their own eyes what this government's job cuts, services cuts and privatisation agenda has done to transport in this state. Here's hoping they send the message loud and clear at the next election.

Speaking of which, just a couple of days ago I spoke at a fundraising event for the ALP candidate for Bega - Leanne Atkinson - who will be running against our Transport Minister, Andrew Constance. I told the room there what I've been telling anyone who will listen for a long time now - it's time for Andrew Constance to go.

This Minister has done nothing but disrespect workers and attack our transport systems since he first stepped foot into parliament. The State Election is still over eight months away, but already the movement to kick Constance out is gaining momentum.

As I type, region six buses have officially become privately run, with Transit Systems taking

the reins from July 1. We know what's going to happen there – it's only a matter of time before services are cut, stops are closed and commuters are forced to deal with longer, more inconvenient journey times. Just ask the people of Newcastle.

You'll note in the articles below that nominations for union elections open on July 2. Being a union representative is a great opportunity to stand up and push for better workplace conditions for yourself and your fellow workers. I hope many of you consider taking up the opportunity to stand for a position in this great union.

Rail workers say the NSW Government's decision to leave Unanderra Station off the list of railway stations that will receive funding to improve accessibility is outrageous and a slap in the face to local commuters.

The NSW Government yesterday revealed that 11 train stations will receive funding to improve accessibility in the upcoming state budget. Unanderra was not on the list despite local commuters and workers lobbying for action to be taken at the station for many years.

Rail, Tram and Bus Union Secretary, Alex Claassens, said that while the announcement of funding for other stations in the state is fantastic and much needed, the decision to leave some stations off the funding list needs further investigation.

"It's ridiculous that in 2018 we still have railway stations that are inaccessible to people with a disability, people with prams and people with mobility issues," Mr Claassens said. Read the entire media release on RTBU Express.

Media Release: NSW Budget, Transport announcements all show, no substance

NSW Budget: Transport announcements all show, no substance

The transport components of today's state budget are more focused on providing good media headlines than on funding genuine improvements to public transport, the RTBU says.

Rail, Tram and Bus Union (RTBU) NSW Secretary, Alex Claasens, said many of the transport announcements in today's budget are all well and good, but lack the substance needed to genuinely improve transport in the state.

"It's what's missing from this budget that tells the real story," Mr Claassens said.

"Of course money for station upgrades is always very welcomed, but what about all of the other stations that are still crying out for accessibility improvements? We still have far too many stations that are inaccessible to less-able commuters.

"Of course, more bus and train services are welcomed, but what about all the services that this government has slashed recently? And the plans to close down a number of the state's rail lines for months on end?"

The RTBU Locomotive and Operations Divisions will be conducting a tour of NSW Trains InterCity areas to discuss with members aspects of the New InterCity Fleet (NIF) introduction, including the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to provide Members with an update on the process so far.

At this stage, NSW Trains management is refusing to allow your Officials to enter your workplace to provide you with this information.

We view the refusal by NSW Trains to allow your Elected Representatives access to your workplace to talk to you, as a sign that their commitment to an open and transparent process is one sided and not in the best interest of their workforce.

Last week, John Holland has announced the redundancies of 36 workers as a result of a \$50 million cut to the rail infrastructure budget by the NSW Government. This is a Government which continues to neglect regional jobs and infrastructure.

We have been involved in discussions with workers and management since these budget cuts were announced, with John Holland being able to reduce the original

number of redundancies from 60 down to 36. These redundancies will still hit our regional workers hard, and devastate families and communities in Dubbo.
