### **ORDERS SOUGHT BY THE NOTIFIER**

- A. Pursuant to s. 136(1)(a) and s137(1)(a) of the *Industrial Relations Act 1996*, the Commission makes the following orders:
  - The Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales, its officers, employees and members who are employed, for the purposes of s. 68C of the *Transport Administration Act 2013*, by the Notifier, are ordered to immediately cease organising and refrain from taking any form of industrial action, including any strike, stop work meeting, ban, relieving ban, limitation or restriction on the performance of work and must not recommence, engage in or threaten to engage in industrial action while these orders are in force.
  - The Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales and its respective officers and employees must not induce, advise, authorise, encourage, direct, aid or abet its members to organise or take further industrial action.
  - These orders shall come into effect on and from 21.30 on 17 May 2017 and shall remain in force until 20:00 on 17 August 2017.
- B. Pursuant to s. 136(1) and s. 163 of the *Industrial Relations Act*, the Commission makes the following directions:
  - The Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales must, by no later than 22:00 on 17 May 2017, provide or cause to be provided a copy of Orders A1, A2 and A3 to its delegates employed by the Notifier.

- 2. The Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales must, by no later than 22:00 on 17 May 2017 issue or cause to be issued a directive or similar memorandum to all members of the Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales employed by the Notifier to ensure that the employees and the members of the Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales are aware of, and comply with, Order A1, including notifying its members of the said Order on a prominent position on its website and the Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales' social media, such as Facebook and Twitter.
- 3. The Rail, Tram and Bus Union of New South Wales must advise the Notifier's representatives in writing by 23:00 on 17 May 2017 of the steps taken to comply with Orders A1, B1 and B2 of these Orders, including the form of notification, and if written, a copy of the notification, and the further steps they intend to take (if any) to comply with the Order in respect of any employee who, by that time, has not been not been notified.
