To: All Caravan Owners & Guests

We have received updates in the early hours of this morning from the administration of the Booderee National Park and the Jervis Bay Territory and while the advice is largely the same there are some subtle differences and we have to follow ALL of their instructions so that we have access to our RTBU Holiday Park,

We have summarised the information below in order to minimise the confusion.

### **Jervis Bay Territory**

In accordance with the Public Health (Jervis Bay Territory) Emergency Direction issued on 21 December, visitors from identified COVID hotspots (that is, Sydney Northern Beaches, Greater Sydney, Central Coast and Wollongong) are **not allowed** to visit the JBT.

JBT is not part of NSW.

Hotspots are subject to change – however, early indication suggests these are likely to remain current until 31/12/20. We have also been notified that the health direction is enforceable, and fines may apply.

Any guests or visitors planning to stay at the RTBU Holiday Park from a Hotspot area is **NOT TO TRAVEL AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE JERVIS BAY TERRITORY.**

### **Booderee National Park**

As we notified in our previous update, Booderee National Park will reopen to most visitors on Thursday 24 December 2020 following a temporary closure from midnight on Monday 21 December 2020. However, in line with COVID restrictions to Jervis Bay Territory, visitors from the Northern Beaches, Greater Sydney, Central Coast and Wollongong Local Government Areas (LGA) will not be permitted to enter the Jervis Bay Territory, including the National Park.

The park will continue to operate under COVID-safe health and safety protocols.

When visitors enter the park, Ticket Booth staff will ask some basic questions and provide all visitors with a list of COVID Hotspots banned from the Jervis Bay Territory and a QR Code to register their attendance in the park. If visitors do not comply, they will be escalated to the Australian Federal Police. The AFP will be doing regular patrols, random roadside stops and enforcing the JBT Emergency Health Directions.
