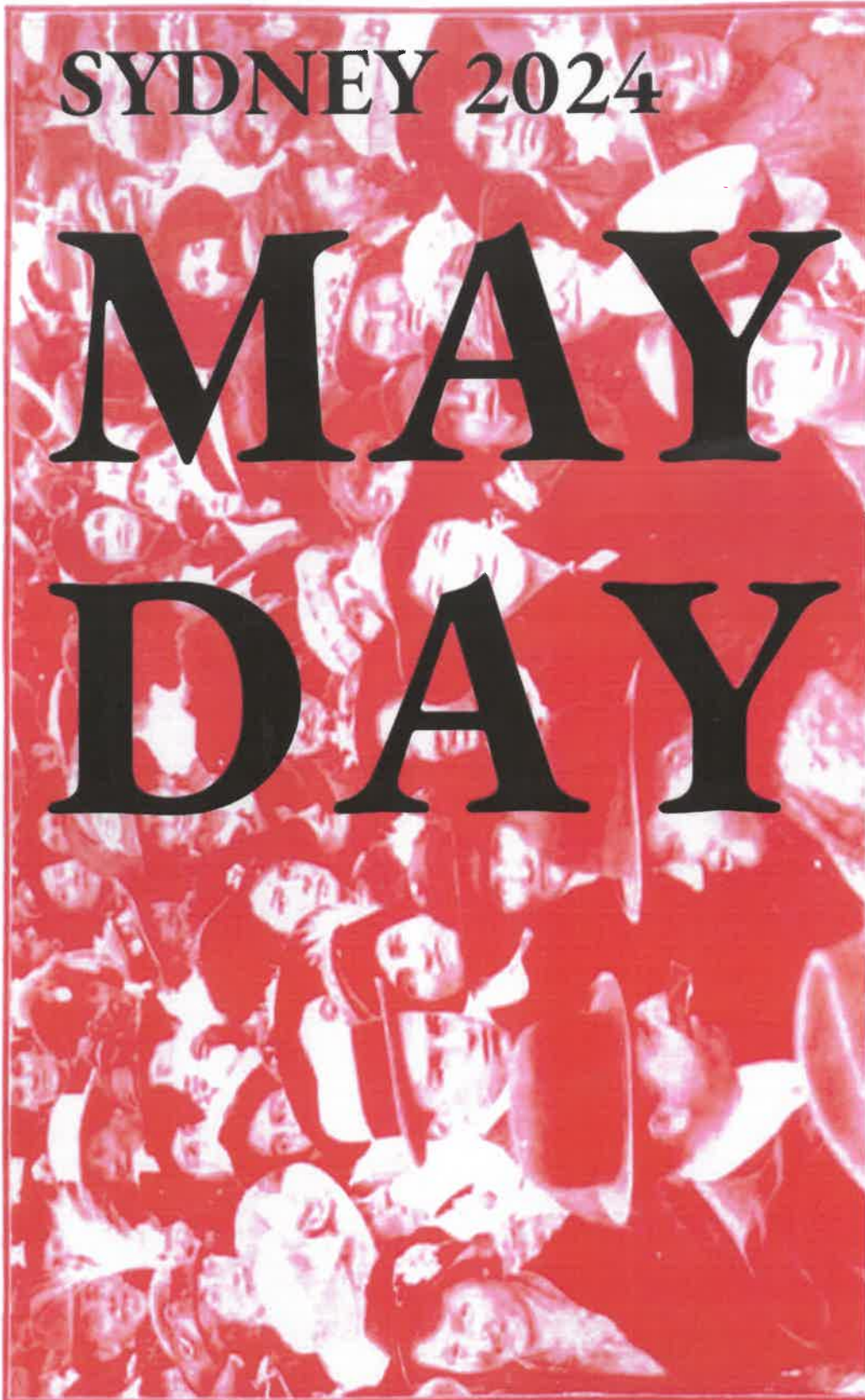


PEACE, SOCIAL JUSTICE, DECENT WORK FOR ALL



WOMEN'S DEMONSTRATION IN FRONT OF PARLIAMENT HOUSE. These women, marching across London, many of whom had walked from Manchester, Newcastle, and other distant suburbs, appeared on the scene on the morning of the 13th of May, 1917. The demonstration, it was stated, represented 15,000 of the workers and women who had entered the industrial field in war time. Mr. Fisher was seen in the crowd, and the women to take the control of the industry out of the hands of the Government.
